I just wanted to pass on heartfelt thanks to all for such generous donations. Your continuing support enabled the Food Bank to help over 30 families last month. None of this could be achieved without your donations.

The food parcels are a life line to many. People are referred via Children's Services/social Services/Citizens Advice/GP Surgeries though no-one is ever turned away.
